NEXT WEEK

From Monday 17th January, children who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to school immediately on day 6, providing you have sent through the NHS notification of both test results.

If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

If you are unsure about when a child should return, please call the office.

YR	We have started to look at our new text 'The Naughty Bus.' We have been painting and drawing our own buses, writing sentences about buses and choosing pictures of our favourite forms of transport.
