School News

YR	This week, we have really enjoyed learning about the Nativity story, especially role playing different parts. Lots of the boys had babies called Jesus! We have re-told the story using small world and we have drawn pictures of the Nativity scene. It has been fantastic to see the children understand the story and then use it in their play!
Y1	In Year 1, we have continued to learn about Space. We researched inspirational female astronaut Mae Jemison and wrote biographies of her. We have also built our own rockets, finding the best trajectory to help them to fly furthest into space.
Y2	We have been writing about the Princess climbing the glass mountain. We acted out her journey and thought about how she felt. In History, we have been continuing our learning about castles. We learnt about the different jobs people living in castles had.
Y3	This week the children have worked hard to write their own Viking Sagas. They have also used their knowledge of tints and shades to create a sky/sea background for their Viking ships.
Y4	We have been learning techniques to help to improve our writing. We can identify similes, metaphors and alliteration. We have used these to write our own poem about Mt. Vesuvius.
Y5	This week, we have been tackling fractions in Maths, including finding equivalent and improper fractions and mixed numbers. We have used mind maps for all of our knowledge about the Mayan civilisation, ready to write a report next week. Following on from our learning last week, we have completed graphs using gestation data and drawn conclusions from this, asking scientific questions.
Y6	This week, Year 6 have been busy making a working periscope in science using a cereal box. We have also been thinking about how Christians respond to Jesus' healing stories. We have enjoyed learning about one of the world's most important inventions- the printing press. In French, we have been learning how to order food and we have also designed our own illuminated letter. What a busy and varied week!
