# School News

YR	We have been reading 'Supertato' and writing speech bubbles. We have also been thinking about our own super powers as we are all special and unique. We had a great time on the train and planting our seeds today!
Y1	This week in Year 1, we had our own 1666 banquet. We enjoyed learning and comparing the different foods rich and poor people ate then and were shocked to find that they enjoyed eating swan and puffin!
Y2	Year 2 really enjoyed painting their own versions of Van Gogh's 'Starry Night.' We were careful to use short strokes of thick paint to replicate his style. We had fun during Science, testing the flexibility of materials. We have written our own wombat stories, trying to use as many of our own ideas as possible.
Y3	This week, Year 3 learnt about using the Internet safely for research. In literacy, we use sub-headings to group information and write an Anglo-Saxon fact file. In DT, we explored ways to join cardboard ready for making helmets.
Y4	This week we have produced fantastic writing using personification about the 'Storm Cat.' In Science, we've had fun making string telephones and learning how sound travels. In Art, we studied Hokusai, a Japanese artist.
Y5	This week, we have been experimenting with paint colours to paint the cover of our class text 'The Lost Happy Endings'. We have also been evaluating sources of evidence in our History topic Crime and Punishment. This week the focus was the Victorians. We learnt about punishments for children that included hard labour, borstal and being whipped! We found primary sources of evidence from the National Archives. Mr Smith and Mrs Claro are rethinking their behaviour strategies!
Y6	To coincide with International Woman's Day, Year 6 have been learning about another inspirational woman- Mary Anning. They have been developing their independent comprehension skills and read her biography. They thought about why she was a 'woman in a man's world'. In PSHE, they have been introduced to Zones of Regulation as a concept for helping to control and monitor their mood and behaviours too.
