Y1	We have had a brilliant first week in Year 1! We have made Robin and Owls to decorate our new classrooms, as well as getting to know our Year 1 classrooms.
Y2	Year 2 have had a great first week settling in and learning new routines. We have been writing about ourselves and our summer holiday in English. In RE we learnt about the Christian story of Creation and thought about what we would like to thank God for creating in our beautiful world.
Y3	We have enjoyed getting to know each other in Year 3. In Maths, we have remembered our place value learning from last year and have continued to practise our times tables. In RE we acted out the story of Noah's Ark and thought about how he felt to be given such a responsible job.
Y4	This week in year 4, the children have been working hard together with new reading buddies. They have made lots of inquiries and predictions on our new class book Oliver and the Seawigs and are very eager to find out if their predictions are correct as we read more.
