Y3	In Science, Y3 used magnets to explore the magnetic poles. We discovered how the poles attract or repel each other. In art, we painted a background for our Viking boat pictures, using tints and shades to create a sky and sea scape in shades of blue. In RE, we heard the story of Guru Nanak and the boulder.		
Y4	This week year 4 had so much fun going to see Puss in Boots at the Trinity and then having a Roman experience at the Amelia Scott. In class, we have used our powerful verbs to write fantastic setting descriptions. In science, we have enjoyed an experiment on changing solids to liquids using chocolate.		
Υ5	Year 5 continued working with Mr Tibbits-Williams, learning how to mix secondary and tertiary colours as well as how to use a paintbrush more accurately. In science, we analysed different animals' gestation period data, comparing the time taken and proposing reasons for any differences. In history, we discovered what we can learn about the ancient Mayans by studying their architecture.		
Υ6	This week, Year 6 has been busy. In RE, the children have been thinking about what Jesus says are the foundations for life; in science they made a periscope and using it explained reflection; in English and history we have taken relevant notes all about the history of print and used these notes to write a non-chronological report. We started making a worm mechanism miniature toy in DT; continued to practise our reading fluency; and discussed bullying and how we should 'make a noise' about it.
