FROSTY STARTS

It has certainly been cold standing on the gates in the morning this week, however it is lovely to hear the children say good morning each day. In worship, we reminded ourselves about our school rule of being respectful and how important it is to greet everyone with a smile and hello. We also looked at the Gospel of Matthew and how Simon Peter was Jesus' Rock. This is a quick round up of what has been happening in each year group this week. You can see what the staff have got to say about the pupils across the School.



School News

YR	We have been learning the story of The Little Red Hen with actions. We have been making playdough and baking bread as the Little Red Hen did and doing science experiments with yeast. We've been bowling skittles in maths and counting how many were left.
Y1	We have introduced this term's core text: The Emperor's Egg. The children have begun to find out new information about emperor penguins and their lifecycles. They were amazed to find out that a male emperor penguin is about the same height as a six-year-old! They have located Antarctica on a world map, and have been learning the names of the continents by singing a continents song.
Y2	Year 2 have enjoyed writing a description of the Titanic using lots of adjectives. In art, we have been learning about Turner's seascapes, and thinking about what life might have been like in Turner's time. We have enjoyed doing a science experiment testing the flexibility and rigidity of different materials.
Y3	This week, in Literacy, Year 3 discovered a juggling act was part of the circus. We watched a skilful performance which inspired our writing as we replaced 'went' with more interesting verbs such as spun, flew, flipped and twirled. In Art, we learnt that the people at the circus needed encouragement to eat a healthier diet so created collage pictures of faces created using pictures of fruit and vegetables, in the style of Acrimboldo.
Y4	In science, we are learning about how to care for our teeth. We have set up a fair experiment to see if there are some things that could damage our teeth. Over the last few weeks, have been looking at finding all the factors in numbers. We have also been looking at multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100. We have found many patterns.
Y5	Using our knowledge gained about hurricanes, we divided into groups to create our own artistic display detailing the different stages of a storm's development. We continued practising our performance of 'When the Saints Come Marching In' on the glockenspiels. In Science, we carried out a fair test to measure the effect of air resistance on falling objects.
Y6	This week, Year 6 have been researching a famous local suffragist, Amelia Scott and writing to her at the Amelia Scott Centre in Tunbridge Wells. In science, we have been investigating refraction by making a colour spectrum wheel and then investigating how shadows can be manipulated. In RE, we have studied the importance of the mosque to Muslims and in PE we have been doing gymnastics.
