School News

YR	This week we visited the Amelia centre as part of our learning about old toys last term. We have been writing questions and learning about road and train safety. In maths, we are finding one more and looking at numbers 6,7 and 8.
Y1	As we read The Emperor's Egg, we found out many interesting facts about Emperor Penguins. This week, we have done some research in other books to find out more facts, and have begun to write information pages, using headings. In Discovery Time, we have looked at the structure of the fish that penguins eat, and labelled parts of a fish. We have used our fine motor skills to carefully build igloos using sugar cubes. This has taken some good teamwork!
Y2	Year 2 have been looking at punctuation and have been re-writing sentences as questions, statements and commands. They have enjoyed exploring the gym apparatus in PE and building bridges in DT.
Y3	In Year 3, we are making connections between multiplication and division. We are thrilled that most children are now practising their times tables on TTR, this is helping them complete their Maths work in class. In ICT, we have used questions to sort information in our branching database.
Y4	This week, we have been writing our TED Talk and have presented them to the class. It has really made us think about our environment and that we can all make a difference. We are loving Mrs Hookway's gymnastic lessons and performing our sequences. We are continuing to recycle our plastic bags into pompoms. In science, we are learning about the digestive system.
Y5	This week, Year 5 have continued to prepare their news articles from the days after Hurricane Katrina hit. We have worked collaboratively to create quotes and practised our acting skills to re-enact the interviews between journalists and New Orleans residents during the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina.
