YR	This week we have been exploring space and writing a list of items we would take with us into space! We've made rockets, and in maths we've been making 9. We investigated tadpoles and learnt about the life cycle of frogs.
Y1	This week in year 1, we have been begun working with numbers to 50. We have been ordering them and representing the tens and ones with manipulatives. We have begun writing stories based on our class text, Stanley's Stick and continued learning about how the Great Fire in 1666 spread.
Y2	Year 2 have been learning about capacity and volume in Maths this week. They have been using 4 operations to work out problems in grams and kilograms. In Science, we have learnt about food chains and have understood the terms predator, prey, consumer and producer. We have also made some amazing Mother's Day cards for Sunday.
Y3	On Monday, Year 3 joined other primary school children at The Recorder festival at TWGGS led by Mrs Morton. The children played several pieces accompanied by TWGGS students on an electric violin, saxophone, piano, clarinet, bass and drums which was a real treat! We enjoyed coming to school in our pyjamas and sharing our favourite books.
Y4	This week Year 4 have had a great time looking at Easter around the world, we looked at other traditions and made omelettes as they do in France. 4B enjoyed Forest school and we all had a good time at World Book Day and sharing our favourite books with each other. In science, we are looking at how vibrations are made.
Y5	In music, Year 5 composed a melody to add to their own piece of music designed to send someone to sleep. Sleep was the last thing on our minds as we played lacrosse and hockey in our PE lesson. In literacy, we continued to read our text, 'The Sleeper and the Spindle', and wrote descriptive paragraphs using similes and subordinating conjunctions.
