### Forest School


On Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> May, 4S (Year 4 – Mr Smith) will be taking part in Forest School.

# Attendance: A message from our Attendance Officer, Mrs Smith!

It has been a pleasure to write and see presented 194 certificates to celebrate excellent and very good attendance at school between Christmas and Easter. A massive **74 children achieved 100% attendance** during this time!

A further **71 children achieved 97% or above** and another **49 children with 96%.** 

This is nearly double the amount of children achieving good and excellent levels of attendance when compared to the attendance in the autumn terms!
